The Rain Water Management System will enhance local water quality by allowing water to be naturally filtered by soil instead of being piped, untreated into large bodies of water. It is an effective method to enhance water quality and control storm water is through the use of rain gardens.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mine Hill Township Board of Education, State of New Jersey, authorizes the submission of the aforementioned Sustainable Jersey for Schools Grant.
