The fee for professional services as outlined above will be a lump sum of \$54,000.00 with the following breakdown:

c. RESOLVED, that the Board of Education accepts the recommendation of the Business Administrator and approves the **Proposal for Professional Services for Partial Roof Replacement**. The scope of work will be to prepare construction documents and contract administration services for the partial reroofing work consisting of approximately 21,515 SF of roof area. As indicated on the attached roof plan, the replacement will be a 3-ply built-up roofing system with a 25-year, no-dollar limit roof warranty. Di Cara | Rubino Architects understands that the work is scheduled for summer of 2022.

At this time, our opinion of probable construction cost is \$710,000.00. Architectural fee not to exceed \$80,000 to be paid out of Bond Referendum 2021, account #: 30.000.400.334.07.553.

FEE PROPOSAL:

The fee for professional services as outlined above will be a lump sum of \$75,000.00 with the following breakdown:

A. Design Development.	\$22,500.00
B. Construction Documents.	\$33,500.00
C. Bidding& Award	\$ 4,000.00
D. Contract Administration	\$ 15,000.00

WHEREAS, the Mine Hill Board of Education will utilize funds to address HVAC units that need replacement parts and or service,
