WHEREAS, the Mine Hill Township School District desires to contract with Saint Clare's to provide such healthcare services.

h. WHEREAS, in response to unprecedented challenges in purchasing and receiving food, The United States Department of Agriculture, Food and Nutrition Service approved federal funding in Federal Fiscal Year 2023 for Supply Chain Assistance (SCA),

WHEREAS, SCA funds must be used to exclusively purchase unprocessed or minimally processed domestic food products and may not be used to cover the cost of pas expenditure, this funds may only be used for current/future expenses,

THEREFORE, the Mine Hill Board of Education received \$12,421.88 for the fourth round of Supply Chain Assistance (SCA).

- i. RESOLVED, that the Board of Education accepts the recommendation of the Superintendent and approves Empowerment Solutions, LLC and the Founder and Executive Director of Empowerment Institute, Inc. to conduct nine (9) coaching sessions at a rate of \$825/session for a total of \$7,425 for the 2023-24 school year. - j. WHEREAS, the Mine Hill Board of Education on June 5, 2023 approved the contract for **Behaviorist** Services with Social Strides LLC, for the extended school year program at a rate of \$125.00 per hour not to exceed \$2,500.00,

WHEREAS, the amount that was in the contract and should have been reference as a not to exceed should have been \$3,580.00,

THERFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education accepts the recommendation of the Business Administrator and approves the revision to the contract for **Behaviorist Services** with **Social Strides LLC**, for the **extended school year program**, **July 3**, **2023 through July 27**, **2023** at the rate of \$125.00 per hour not to exceed \$3,580.00. The district used the Comparable Process to ensure the district received a fair and competitive price as per N.J.A.C.6A:23A-9.3(c)(11). To be paid out of account **11.000.216.320.00.109**.

k. WHEREAS, the Mine Hill Board of Education on April 24, 2023 approved the contract with Clarity for wireless access points, licenses and professional services for a cost of \$9,853.20, cabling for a cost of \$2,120.00 for a total of \$11,973.20,

WHEREAS, the installation price of \$1,400.00 was not included in the original total cost,

THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Board of Education accept the recommendation of the Business Administrator and approve Clarity for **E-Rate Services** wireless access points, licenses and professional services for a cost of \$9,853.20, cabling in the amount of \$2,120.00 and installation in the amount of \$1,400.00 for a total not to exceed \$13,373.20.

 In Accordance with N.J.S.A 184A:18A-42 and based upon the recommendations the Superintendent that Center for Responsive Schools, Inc. for the 2023-24 school year to provide services to the school district in an effective and efficient manner;

- m.
