NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, the Board of Education accepts the **Treasurer and Board Secretary Reports** above referenced reports and certifications subject to reconciliation of the secretary's report with the statements of cash position and reconciliation report when received, and orders that it be attached to and made part of the record of this meeting; and

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, in compliance with N.J.A.C. 6A:23-2.11(c)4, the board of Education certifies that, after review of the board secretary's and statements of cash position and reconciliation monthly financial reports (appropriation section) and upon consultation with the appropriate district officials, to the best of its knowledge, no major account or fund has been over-expended in violation of N.J.A.C. 6A:23-2.11(b), and that sufficient funds are available to meet the district's financial obligations for the remainder of the year.

WHEREAS, the ABC Growing Tree will be providing the Mine Hill Board of Education a total of 2 classrooms for the 23-24 SY for a total enrollment of 15 students per classroom a total of 30 students.

WHEREAS, Preschool Education Program Contract has been reviewed by Administration and legal counsel and recommending the approval of the agreement for the 2023-2024 School Year,

RESOLVED, that the Board of Education accepts the recommendation of the Superintendent and approves the contract with **ABC Growing Tree for the expansion of the preschool program** for a maximum of 30 students (15 per class) at a rate of \$16,862 per pupil less Administration fees in the amount of \$78,828.00 for a total contract amount of \$427,032.00 per school year. Amount will be prorated based on enrollment and number of months operating for a monthly cost of \$42,703.20.

f. WHEREAS, **Northeastern Roof has submitted a change order No. GC-02** for a credit from the remaining balance from Allowance #1;

The original contract sum was \$688,000.00, the contract sum prior to this Change Order was \$688,000.00, the contract sum will be decreased by this Change Order in the amount of (\$13,150.00), the new Contract Sum including this Change Order will be \$674,850.00;

WHEREAS, Di Cara Rubino Architects and Administration have reviewed the change order and recommends approval;

NOW, THREFORE BE IT RESOLVED, that the Mine Hill Board of Education approves change order **GC-02**.

g. WHEREAS, the Mine Hill Board of Education, hereafter referred to as "Educational Facility" is a member of the **School Alliance Insurance Fund**, hereinafter referred to as "Fund";

WHEREAS, said renewal membership terminates as of July 1, 2023 at 12:01 a.m. standard time, unless earlier renewed by agreement between the Educational Facility and the Fund; WHEREAS, the Educational Facility is afforded the following types of coverages: Workers' Compensation Supplemental Indemnity - Workers' Compensation Package - Property, Boiler & Machinery, General and Auto Liability, Environmental Impairment Liability Excess Liability (AL/GL) School Leaders Professional Liability Excess Liability (SLPL)

WHEREAS, the Educational Facility desires to renew said membership;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED as follows: 1. The Educational Facility agrees to renew its membership in the Fund for a period of three years beginning **July 1, 2023, and ending July 1, 2026** at 12:01 a.m. eastern standard time, and to be subject to the coverages, operating procedures, bylaws, and other organizational and operational documents of the Fund presently existing or as from time to time amended by the Fund and/or the Department of Banking and Insurance. 2. The Educational Facility's Business Official, is hereby appointed as the Educational Facility's Fund Commissioner and is authorized to execute the renewal Indemnity and Trust Agreement thereby evidencing annexed hereto and made a part hereof and to deliver same to the Fund the Educational Facility's renewal of its membership.
